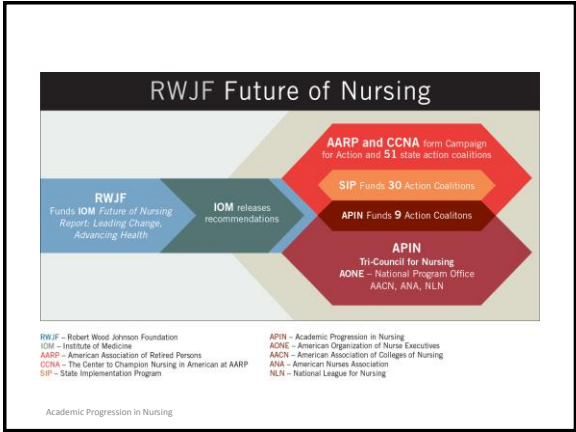

Academic Progression in Nursing **FUTURE OF NURSING™**
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Help more diverse nurses continue with their education.

- RWJF and Tri-Council for Nursing.
- Nine states selected to test one of four promising models.
- Each state received \$300,000, with chance to reapply in two years.

Advancing Academic Progression **FUTURE OF NURSING™**
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Promising solutions

1. Shared statewide or regional curriculum.
2. Competency-based curricula.
3. Community colleges granting BSN degrees on their campuses.
4. RN-to-MSN programs for AD students.

Academic Progression in Nursing

California **FUTURE OF NURSING™**
Campaign for Action

Inaugural cohort (69 students) from 7 community colleges (CCs) successfully completed their first dual enrolled summer at CSULA. 10 CCs now joined in the collaborative with 80 students in the next cohort. These students seamlessly transfer to matriculation and graduation in one year post ADN completion.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Hawaii **FUTURE OF NURSING™**
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The agreement by both public and private institutions to establish a competency-based, common curriculum with shared learning outcomes.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Massachusetts

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Development and adoption of a Nursing Education Transfer Compact (NETC) - a statewide transfer agreement to facilitate seamless academic progression from the state's 18 public community colleges and 8 public RN-BSN programs.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Montana

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Launch of the statewide APIN Mentoring Program and Preceptor Program-- these efforts have created a unified vision between practice and academia regarding the necessity of BSN education in Montana.

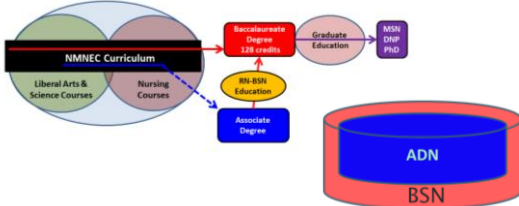

New Mexico

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The NMNEC Model:

- Common statewide nursing curriculum for pre-licensure BSN education through university/community college partnerships



Academic Progression in Nursing

18

New York

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118 students were retained to enter the second year of study for a 92% retention rate. Four new collaborative partners, including the last remaining diploma program in NY and a historically African American college, have been recruited to participate in the program. The State Education Department has called on our partnership to provide expertise and assistance in accrediting/ registering future programs using the 1+2+1 Model.

Academic Progression in Nursing

North Carolina

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190 students dually enrolled in in RIBN educational pathway in 5 regions of the state; 2 more regions to admit their first students in 2014. The regional partnerships between universities and CCs involved in the RIBN include greater than 40% of the ADN and BSN nursing education programs in the state.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Texas

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Presented, adapted strategies, and tailored contracts for the Consortium to Advance Baccalaureate Nursing Education in Texas ("CABNET") Agreement. To date three universities and 16 community colleges signed. Development of a diversity program.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Washington

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Launch of three (3) RN-BSN programs and the planning for another.

Academic Progression in Nursing

Where Are We With Grant Progress

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- The first grant will be completed in August 2014
- All grantees recommended for an additional two years of funding, through August 2016
- Grant announcement by RWJF in June
- APIN-2 Grants begin in August
- APIN-2 Grants focus on:
 - Expansion of the model selected
 - Academic Practice Partnerships
 - Diversity and Inclusion
 - Sustainability/Institutionalization of efforts beyond the grant period
- Moving Forward Meeting Follow Up
