Nurse Leaders Across Montana

Do you ever feel the issues in your community are not being properly addressed? We encounter many concerns that affect the quality of health for all Montanans --policy makers attempt to address these issues at the federal, state, and local levels, but many lack the knowledge to make informed choices regarding the health of our residents. We will walk through the stages of the policy process and identify specific stages where nurses and other Public Health professionals can (and should) participate. Concrete examples will illustrate the myriad of ways these professionals can become active and engaged leaders within their communities.

A 2017 survey distributed by the MT CAHN, to 137 nurse managers throughout the state revealed a gap in leadership knowledge among those working in rural Montana. The purpose of this project was to pilot an online nurse leadership education program for nurse managers working in rural critical access hospitals in Montana; results of the project showed several gaps between leadership roles, competencies and the completion of leadership education for these nurses. These gaps will be described, and recommendations made for how to help close them.
